#### **PROTOCOLS:**

- <u>Text Rendering Protocol</u> can be used during reading
- <u>Dyads Protocol</u> can be used before, during, or after engaging w/content
- <u>Four Corners</u> can be used before, during, after engaging with content (see also this <u>handout</u>)
- Fishbowl can be used after learning content
- <u>Clarifying bookmark</u> can be used in small discussion, during reading/engaging w/content

#### **TOOLS:**

- <u>Discussion Skills</u>- skills to model and teach explicitly
- <u>Accountable Talk Stems</u> Phrases/prompts to support the use of academic language
- <u>Discussion tracker</u> students look for effective discussion practices in peers
- <u>Self Monitoring Sheet</u> students set goals and reflect on effective discussion practices

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
